Institutes of Christian Religion

- ▶ Mortal body, immortal soul
- ▶ Soul animates body
- ▶ In need of restoration from Christ (pure righteousness)

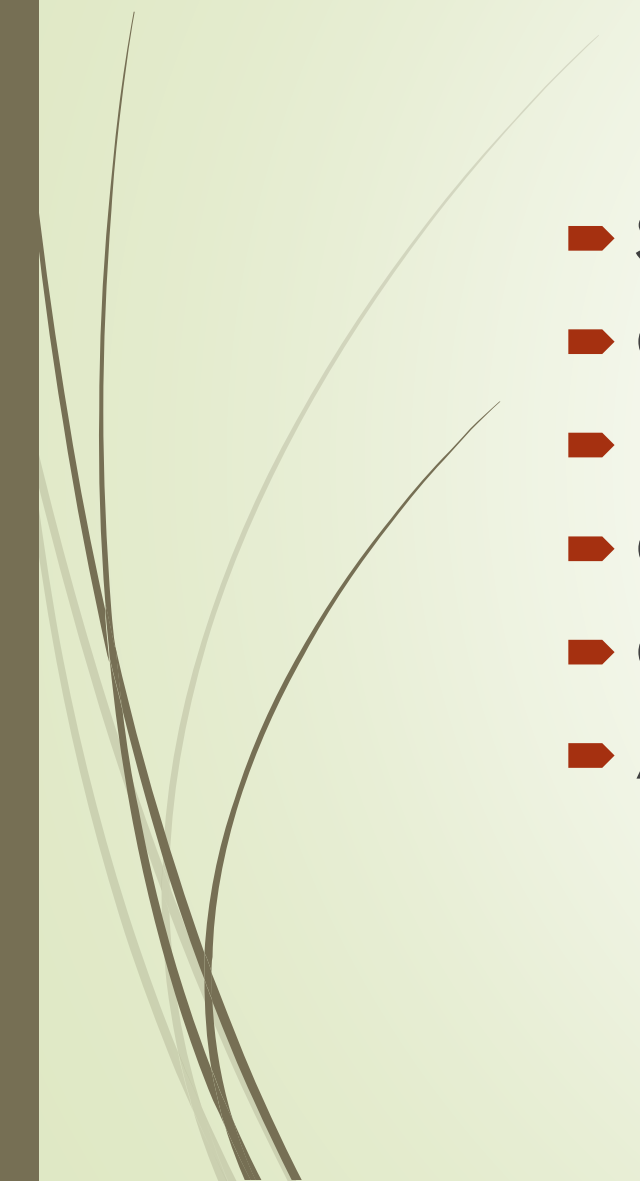


First Adam disobedient Last Adam obedient servant

- ▶ Jesus focuses concern on others
- ▶ Agape self-giving love
- ▶ Selfless
- ▶ Equality, dignity, respect



Sin is rebellion against God

 - Causing pain, destruction of others
 - Robs freedom
 - Calvin: Sin is evil, guilt that disfigures image of God
 - Corrupts God's will for human beings
 - Adam and Eve try to be like God
